

*Passed at a General Meeting of the Society,  
October 6th, 1874.*

# BYE LAWS.



1. Any Member or Tenant entering into or going out of the Allotment otherwise than by the gates; or any Member leaving the gate open, he shall be fined six-pence for either offence.
2. Any Member or Tenant trespassing on the pathway or land belonging to another Member shall be fined sixpence, except he has leave from the owner or occupier. Any Member will be allowed to take with him his friends subject to this rule, but should any trespass or damage be committed, the Member or Tenant conducting them will be responsible.
3. If it can be clearly proved that any Member has robbed another of his produce, or removed his land mark, so as to encroach on

his allotment he shall pay a fine of Fifty Shillings, and if any Tenant be found so doing he shall be prosecuted according to law, and his Landlord be requested to give him a discharge from his land; and if his Landlord refuse to give him a discharge, he shall pay the above fine of Fifty Shillings himself.

4. If any Member break the Stakes that divide the land or pieces he shall make it good within one month, or be fined One Shilling.

5. No Member or Tenant shall allow his dog or any other animal to stray on another man's Allotment, and if he be found so doing he shall be fined Six-pence.

6. The Committee shall keep in good repair all the Roads and Fences belonging to the Society; the Roads shall be thirty feet wide when completed, which shall be done within four years from the time the Society enters on it. No Member or Tenant shall be allowed to leave any twitch or rubbish on the Roads, and if any Member or Tenant be found so doing, the Committee shall have power to set a man to clear it away and charge the Member for the same being done.

7. If any malicious damage or theft be committed upon the produce of any Member's Allotment, he shall inform the Secretary, who

shall at once call together the Committee, and shall take such steps as they may think proper, and all expenses incurred thereby shall be paid by the Society.

8. All fines shall be paid to the Secretary, who shall pay the same over to the Treasurer, such monies to be used for the purpose of prosecuting offenders: should the fines collected be insufficient to meet the expenses, the Committee shall have power to lay a levy in proportion to the shares.

9. Any Member, who from non-payment or other causes, being expelled from the Society (in accordance with the General Laws), all cropping left on his land shall be valued by a competent person selected and approved by such Member and the Committee, and credited to his account.

10. When any Member has paid the full amount to be secured on his share or shares (as specified in the General Laws), he shall still continue to pay a weekly contribution of one penny per week for Office Rent, and shall pay towards all other incidental expenses, according to the number of shares he may hold, until such time as the Allotments become each man's own property; such Members as above stated shall be entitled to vote on all occasions, or hold office, &c., the same as another Member.

11. Any Member having any grievance of which the Managing Committee refuse to notice, or otherwise being in any way dissatisfied with the decision of the Committee in any particular case, they shall have power to convene a Special Meeting of the Members by sending a requisition to that effect to the Secretary, stating their case, and signed by at least three Members.

12. No addition or alteration shall be made to these Rules except at a special meeting called for that purpose.
